Priority Topics for Reviews

Cochrane has released a priority review list for 2015-16 of "either new titles or reviews requiring updates, that best meet the needs of healthcare and health policy decision makers."

The list includes seven neonatal reviews, including:



- Chlorhexidine skin or cord care for prevention of mortality and infections in neonates - new review published March 2015
- Comparison of animal-derived surfactants for the prevention and treatment of respiratory distress syndrome in preterm infants - new review soon to be published
- 3. Cooling for newborns with hypoxic ischaemic encephalopathy *updated review soon to be published*
- Diagnostic accuracy of pulse oximetry screening for critical congenital heart defects - new review soon to be published
- Anti-vascular endothelial growth factor (VEGF) drugs for treatment of retinopathy of prematurity - new review soon to be published
- 6. Probiotics for prevention of necrotizing enterocolitis in preterm infants *review update under construction*
- 7. Effects of targeting higher versus lower arterial oxygen saturations on death or disability in preterm infants new review under construction

Chlorhexidine skin or cord care for prevention of mortality and infections in neonates

"A low-cost antiseptic used to cleanse the cord after birth could help reduce infant death rates in developing countries by 12%, a systematic review published in the Cochrane Library suggests.

Authors of the review found that when chlorhexidine was used on babies born outside of a hospital, it reduced the number of newborn babies who died or suffer from infections." ~ Evelyn Martinez, Senior Publicist, Wiley

- 4. Paracetamol (acetaminophen) for patent ductus arteriosus in preterm or low-birth-weight infants

Review Updates Published:

- Delayed introduction of progressive enteral feeds to prevent necrotising enterocolitis in very low birth weight infants
- Glutamine supplementation for young infants with severe gastrointestinal disease
- Restricted versus liberal water intake for preventing morbidity and mortality in preterm infants
- 4. Slow advancement of enteral feed volumes to prevent necrotising enterocolitis in very low birth weight infants
- 5. Surfactant for meconium aspiration syndrome in term and late preterm infants
- 6. Ibuprofen for the treatment of patent ductus arteriosus in preterm or low birth weight (or both) infants
- Inositol in preterm infants at risk for or having respiratory distress syndrome
